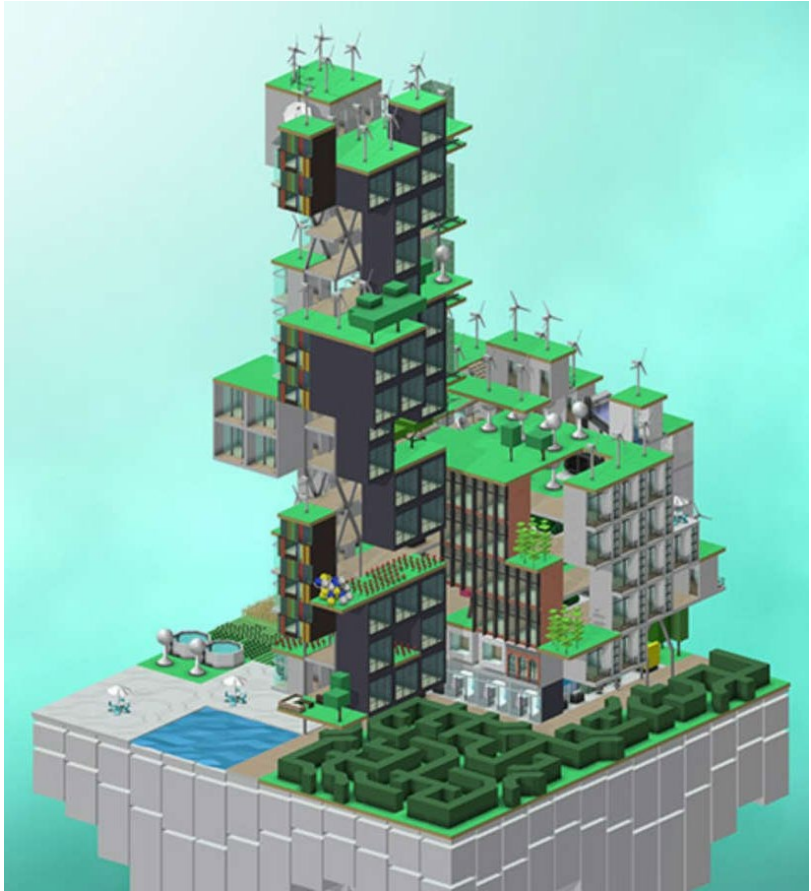

The reason is obvious: **architecture is not, can not and must not be an exclusively personal art. It is a collective art.**

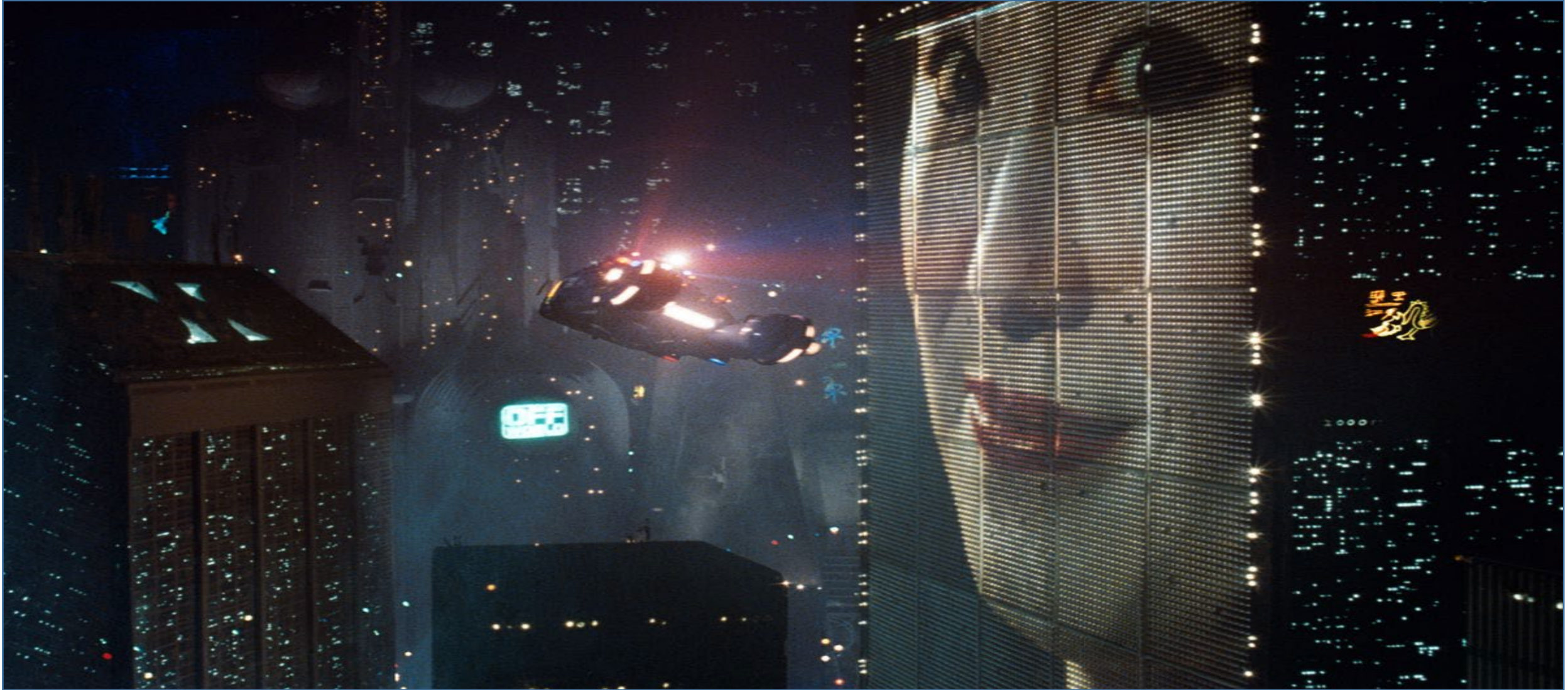
The authentic architect is an entire people. The people provides the resources for construction, indicates its purpose and makes it unitary.

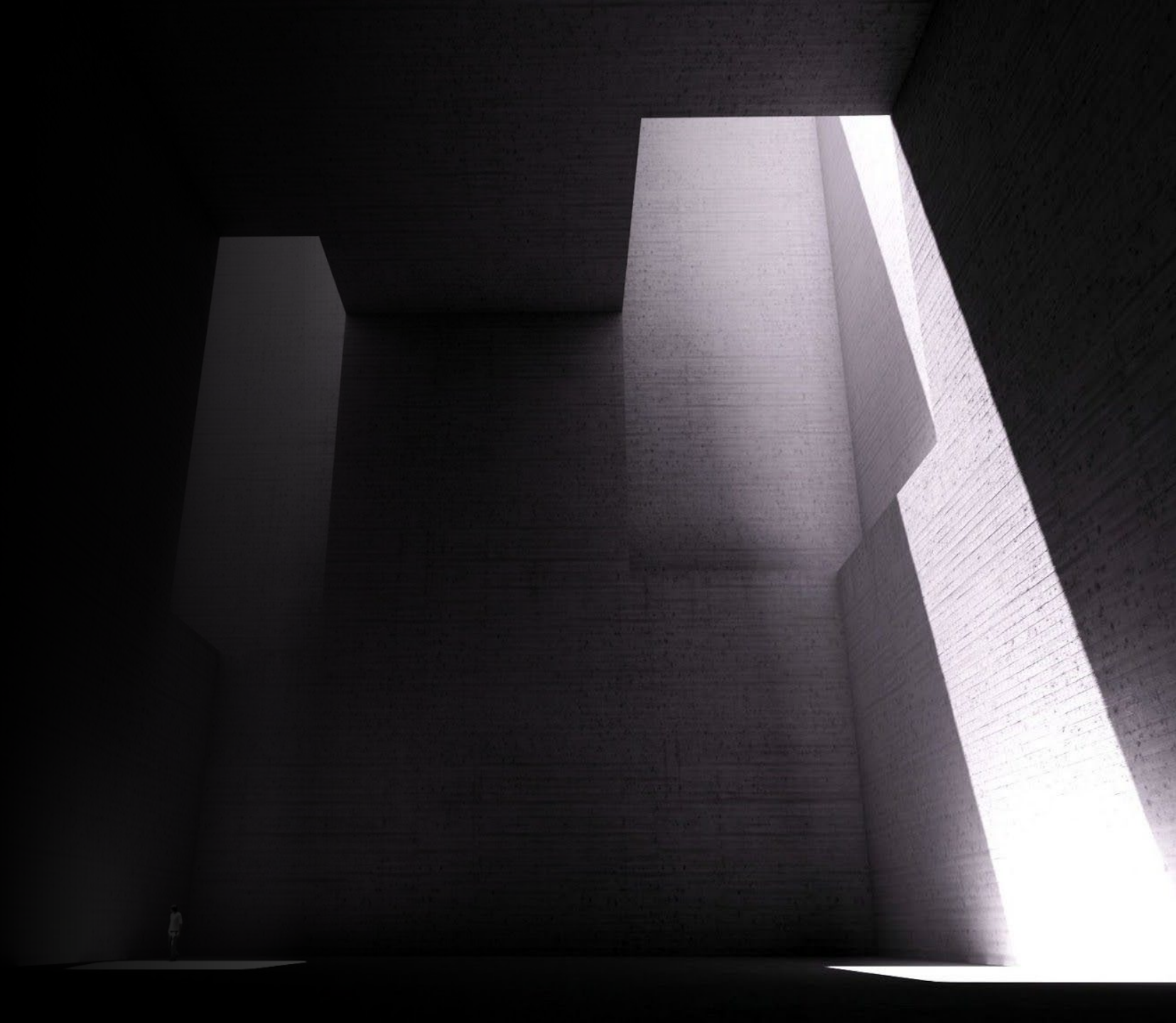

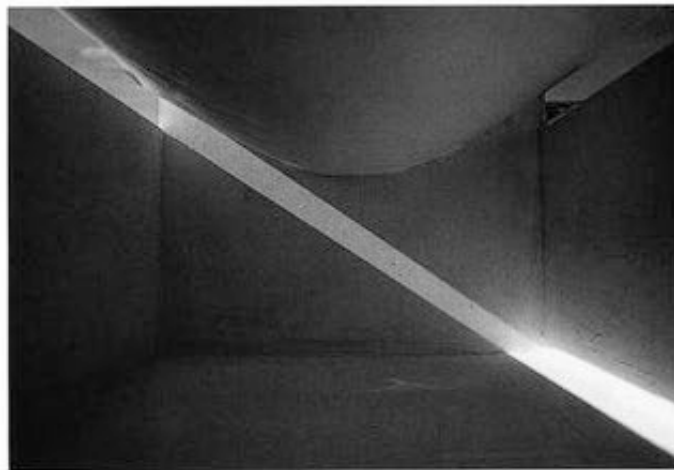

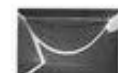
